April brings thoughts of renewal and fresh beginnings. We look forward to budding trees and blooming flowers. Intrigued with a painting idea to jumpstart the imagination using snippets of poetry, I am spending April with a sketchbook and doing thumbnails of images that occur from each piece. The idea is to spend a few minutes letting one thumbnail lead to another, to another....thinking about shapes, variations on composition, values, edges, and design. Then to get painting!

Here are some Painting Ideas from Poetry that might inspire you : “My love is like a melody,” A Red, Red Rose by Robert Burns; “A Door just opened on a street” by Emily Dickinson, or her poem “Experiment of Green.” Or Alan Seeger’s 1917 poem, “ I have a Rendezvous with Death” or “Ode to the West Wind by Percy Shelley; “ My hands are full of Blossoms” by Elizabeth Barrett Browning; or my favorite by Wordsworth: “I wandered lonely as a cloud that floats on high o’er vales and hills, When all at once I saw a crowd, A host, of golden daffodils.....”

April is also bringing some exciting new offerings to the Pocatello Art Center. We are fortunate to have Marsha Losser chairing our Education Committee and she welcomes ideas from members about future classes or workshops. In response to many of our members saying that they believe knowing how to use social media is an essential 21st Century skill and that they would like to know how to promote their art more effectively, she has scheduled a workshop by Dave Corbet entitled **Marketing Ideas Using Social Media, Website and Email.** The workshop will cover all things Social Media and Web related. It is free to all current dues-paying members of the PAC!

He is also offering a class called, **Creating Abstract Art**

Membership Dues Notice.....Change in Procedure EVERYBODY'S DUES ARE DUE APRIL 1, 2018

The Annual Membership drive is now beginning. Membership dues help the Pocatello Art Center grow its programs, offer art classes and workshops and connect artists from all walks of life. We work to enrich the lives of adults, children, and community members through art experiences and art education. To simplify our work, the Board has decided to eliminate the current staggered dues structure as it has been difficult to administer. All membership dues will be payable March 31st of each year. Implementing the new structure will take some work, but we believe it will make bookkeeping much easier for our all-volunteer organization. Dues for an individual are \$35 per year or around \$3 per month. If you normally renew in February you would owe \$6 for February and March and then \$35 for the rest of the year. You will receive a letter explaining the new system in the near future. Thank you for your continued support and patience as we implement our new system.

***Minutes:** Linda Groom moved to accept the minutes as written. Pat Geiger second.

***Treasurer's Report:** The Budget that was passed out is current until the end of February. There are three months left in the fiscal year. The apartments are currently rented and there have been no repairs for a few months. Karen Vargason moved to accept the Budget. Joyce Rendace second.

***Correspondence:** Peggy is caught up on correspondence.

***Desk:** Kurt Camerud will be the Desk Chairman with help from Bea Cowger and Barbara Orr. Kurt created a seal that can be made into stickers and used on correspondence from PAC. Joyce Rendace made a motion to accept the seal design with some changes. Carolyn Purnell second. Motion passed. Debbie Cotant is a new volunteer for the desk. She will also be helping with the Education Committee.

***Office Management:** The new computer system to facilitate sales at the desk is almost finished. A basic training will be held in March. A training for all Desk volunteers will be held after that.

***Fund Raising/Development:** The Fundraising Committee created a Membership Campaign letter that will be sent to all members of PAC during the month of March. The plan is to eliminate the current staggered dues structure as it has been difficult to administer. All dues will be payable April 1 of each year. There will be some challenges this year as the dues are pro-rated and everyone gets moved to the new system.

*The group is also recommending that PAC apply for a \$3,000 grant to help fund the Sagebrush Art Fest for the summer of 2018. The Fundraising group will meet and prepare the grant to the Idaho Community Foundation.

The Board is very appreciative of the work Marilyn and her committee did. This show will be going to ISU for display in April.

***IWS:** Linda Aman presented a wonderful workshop on Rust and Corrosion at the beginning of March. She was an enthusiastic teacher. The group enjoyed it.

***PASI:** They talked about their history to contribute to the PAC History. They are working on projects for their show in August.

***PVPS:** The Judged Show will be in April. Judging will be Saturday, March 31. Entries will be accepted March 29-31 at PAC. The show will hang Tuesday, April 3. There will be a reception on Thursday night, April 5.

GUIDELINES FOR THE ANNUAL JUDGED SHOW
(See your Directory for more details)

1. You may enter up to 3 items at **\$10.00** per item.
2. The 3 items can be any combination of categories, and/or levels at \$10.00 each.
3. **Paintings/art cannot be larger than 40" wide including the frame. The Gallery Committee will not accept any art that is larger than those dimensions.**
All art must be the artist's original work.
4. All hanging art work must be framed and ready for hanging. No gator hook hangers that screw into the top of the frame.
A tight wire attached on each side 3-4 inches from the top of the frame works very well for our hanging system.
5. No work from copyrighted material is acceptable.
6. Work should have been completed within the last 3 years.
7. All art must be identified on the Art Center card with artist name and title of art; any work for sale should be marked with a price on the Art Center card.
8. Identifiable signatures on the front of paintings/other art will be covered during the judging process.
9. Work that has won in past PAC Art Shows cannot be entered.
10. Gallery wrapped canvases are acceptable, but must be painted on all sides and meet the same criteria listed in #3 of these Guidelines.
11. There will be an additional entry fee of **\$25.00** on each piece of artwork submitted by non-members.

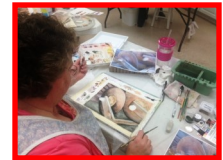
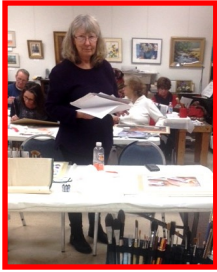
