In **March** we enjoy the color "green" by celebrating St. Patrick's Day with our Irish friends and family rejoicing in their heritage by wearing green, eating corned beef and cabbage, drawing leprechauns and wearing shamrocks. Student art will hang in the Center during March. First prize in each group receives \$50, second \$25, third \$20, and fourth \$15. "Best of Show" is awarded \$100. The "People's Choice" art piece also receives \$100. Marilyn Smith is our capable 2018 chair and Karen Vargason aptly designed the invitations and is preparing the award certificates. The show travels to a gallery in the Art Department at Idaho State University in April. Drop by the Center and cast your vote your favorite piece!

**March** 2<sup>nd</sup> is Dr. Seuss's birthday and is the annual Read across America Day, where kids and adults celebrate the joys of reading. When you have finished reading Green Eggs and Ham to your favorite child, we also invite you to our extensive library of beautiful art books available for checkout at the Art Center. A helpful and favorite book of mine, *Oil Painting Secrets from a Master* by Linda Cateura profiles her teacher, David Leffel who taught classes at the Art Student League of New York in life drawing, painting portraiture, figure and composition. ### **Membership Dues Notice.....Change in Procedure EVERYBODY'S DUES ARE DUE APRIL 1, 2018**

The Annual Membership drive is now beginning. Membership dues help the Pocatello Art Center grow its programs, offer art classes and workshops and connect artists from all walks of life. We work to enrich the lives of adults, children, and community members through art experiences and art education. To simplify our work, the Board has decided to eliminate the current staggered dues structure as it has been difficult to administer. **\*March Board Meeting:** The next Board Meeting is scheduled for March 1, but there is a conflict schedule with a watercolor workshop and the High School Art Show. **\*Correspondence:** January was a busy month with several new members and illnesses.

**\*Desk:** There was a training for the Desk volunteers. We need a new permanent person for Thursday afternoons and Wednesday mornings.

**\*Maintenance:** Bea and Kurt have volunteered to be temporary maintenance people while Wayne is gone.

**\*Office Management:** PAC has a new modem and a new login for the internet.

**Fundraising/Development:** PAC received two new grants. One from the Spaulding Foundation in the amount of \$2430 to fund the 2018 High School Art Show in March and one from the Bistline Foundation in the amount of \$4844.95 to expand our Youth-and-Art programs. We are also starting our annual dues program.

**Community Outreach Reports: Barbara Orr**

**\*Publicity:** In the February Newsletter there is a link for Richard Albright's display.

**\*Membership:** We have 83 people getting Newsletters by mail and 139 by e-mail. There will be a Membership Drive to move all memberships being due on April 1. There will be some awkwardness in moving from the staggered collection of dues to the new way. To help there will be a chart at the Desk.

**\*History of PAC:** The committee began meeting in May of 2017. They looked through all the scrapbooks, minutes, Newsletters, and did some interviews with previous presidents. As they continue the research, they will look at the pre-history of PAC that began at the YWCA. The first group began in 1960 in a house at 454 North Garfield. In 1961 they opened the first art gallery there. In 1963 the Camera Club, the precursor to PVPS, began to have displays there too. There has been a long association of the two clubs. Roger is writing the history of the Photography Club. The committee members are Sallee Gasser, Peggy Anderson, Barbara Santos, and Mary Lien and Carolyn Purnell.

2001 is when the PAC moved here. The first show was in March. Carolyn came in 2001. She began taking photographs and is making scrapbooks.

The Bannock County Museum and the Special Collections section of the ISU Library are interested in the history.

**\*Legacy Project:** Roger Boe has contacted Bob Rush's wife about the possibility of honoring Bob Rush. She is delighted for this opportunity to show his work. The tentative plan is for June.

**\*Newsletter:** Carolyn appreciates everyone getting their articles submitted in a timely manner in for publishing. The profiles of people have been popular. The February Newsletter had a very nice feature story about Carol Myers. Barbara Orr suggested sending Featured Articles to her and she will send them to the ISJ.

**GUIDELINES FOR THE ANNUAL JUDGED SHOW**  
*(See your Directory for more details)*

1. You may enter up to 3 items at **\$10.00** per item.
2. The 3 items can be any combination of categories, and/or levels at \$10.00 each.
3. **Paintings/art cannot be larger than 40" wide including the frame. The Gallery Committee will not accept any art that is larger than those dimensions.**  
**All art must be the artist's original work.**
4. All hanging art work must be framed and ready for hanging. No gator hook hangers that screw into the top of the frame. A tight wire attached on each side 3-4 inches from the top of the frame works very well for our hanging system.
5. No work from copyrighted material is acceptable.
6. Work should have been completed within the last 3 years.
7. All art must be identified on the Art Center card with artist name and title of art; any work for sale should be marked with a price on the Art Center card.
8. Identifiable signatures on the front of paintings/other art will be covered during the judging process.
9. Work that has won in past PAC Art Shows cannot be entered.
10. Gallery wrapped canvases are acceptable, but must be painted on all sides and meet the same criteria listed in #3 of these Guidelines.
11. There will be an additional entry fee of **\$25.00** on each piece of artwork submitted by non-members.

**Level III Advanced Intermediate** - an artist who may sell and display and who has had extensive training and/or worked independently in an art medium on a regular basis.

**Level IV Advanced / Professional** - an artist who has received awards in other shows; one who sells their work and/or teaches.
