Board Summary of Minutes
January 3, 2019

**President Carolyn Purnell called the meeting to order at 10:20am.

1- Administration/Art Center Building Group: Carolyn Purnell

*Carolyn told the Board that Linda Barnier passed away in December. Linda was a member and a big supporter of PAC.

***Minutes:** Peggy Bain moved to accept the minutes as written. Pat second. Motion passed.

***Treasurer's Report:** The Holiday Show had \$1658 in holiday sales. December was the stronger month in sales. Nicole has cash for the individual artists for their sales. For the Budget, Nicole averaged the last 3 years to determine a budget for each category. PAC spends about the amount it brings in. Larry moved to accept the Treasurer's Report. Marsha second. Motion passed.

***Correspondence:** There is no correspondence.

***Desk:** Kurt Camerud wrote a letter to the membership to encourage people to volunteer to help at the Front Desk. We need help on Mondays and Wednesday afternoons.

***Credit Card:** There have been several complaints about the procedure for taking credit cards at the front desk. Larry Petersen brought a spreadsheet that showed the fees associated with taking credit cards. These are the fees PAC pays for each credit card transaction. The fees vary depending on which institution the account is run through. PAC currently uses PayPal. By using the card reader and tablet or by using the credit card "Button" on the receipt program on the computer at the Desk, PAC only pays a percentage of each transaction instead of a monthly fee and a percentage of the transaction.

After looking at the numbers and a discussion, the Board decided to use the current procedures. The password on the tablet will be changed so it's easier to type. There will be more training for Desk Volunteers. Larry made a motion to use the PayPal buttons and the card reader for taking credit or debit cards. There will be a \$10.00 minimum charge for customers using a card for transactions. Georgia second. The Motion passed.

***Maintenance:** A fan in the furnace went out so the furnace was not working and it was cold. Voghts came and replaced the fan. The furnace works great now.

***Office Management:** The new Directory will be finished by the next Board Meeting. They will be available at the Front Desk during the month of February. It will be announced in the Newsletter.

***Fund Raising/Development:**

*The Fundraising and Finance Committees will be combined. Jennifer will work with Niccole on Finance.

*There will be a Membership Drive again this year.

2. Community Outreach Reports:

***Sagebrush:** *A meeting will be held on January 10, at 10am. All Board members are invited to attend. This will be a very in-depth discussion about the focus of PAC and whether or not to continue Sagebrush.

***Publicity:** Sallee wrote an article about Jerry Younkin Griffin that was in the paper. There will be an article about Dallen Lambson's workshop.

***History of PAC:** The Committee was asked to change the focus of the History. The focus will be a shorter history and more focus on the artists who have been members. The published document will be a more enjoyable read so the community will be more likely to purchase. This will also help in receiving a grant to help with publishing costs.

***Legacy Project:** Jerry Younkin Griffin will be featured in January.

***Library:** Audrey Cole is the Librarian. There is an app for an Electronic Library that will help get the Library set up and know what books we have. It will help with check-out too. Larry made a motion that PAC get the Electronic Library. Pat second. Motion passed.

3. Education Group: Marsha Losser

*Dallen Lambson will have a workshop on January 11-12. There will be a demonstration for the public on Thursday night, January 10, from 6-9pm.

*Melinda Cooper will have a "Meet the Artist" relief and sculpting demo on February 21.

*Peggy Bain will teach a Beginning Oil class on Saturdays in April, beginning April 6. They will be 9-12.

*Marilyn Smith is in charge of the High School show in March.

New Business:

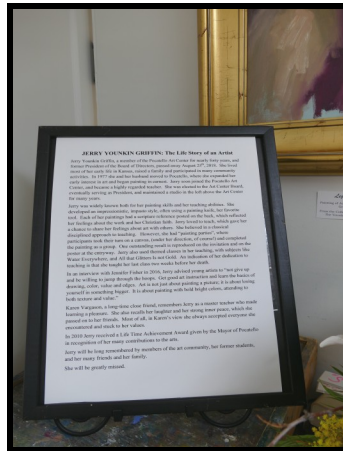
*Marilyn Smith will be our contact person for the Front Desk for questions and subs.
