That same year, Peggy along with other members of the YMCA, organized the Pocatello Art Center. Peggy has remained active and is instrumental in the success of the Art Center.

Peggy is recognized for her outstanding skills in porcelain and oil painting. Many of her pieces are in private art collections in the surrounding area. She has also exhibited in several Pocatello venues.

You will gain a better eye for color and greater confidence in color mixing while making useful value and color charts that can also be used for future painting references. Whether you are just starting out or have some experience with color this workshop will help you masterfully mix color no matter what your skill level or medium used. All levels are welcome.

***Sagebrush:** A final Sagebrush report was also submitted to the ICF for the grant received by them in the amount of \$3700. Their support of PAC has been substantial and is sincerely appreciated.

***Membership Program:** The Art Center is comprised of over 200 members including the Porcelain Artists of Southeastern Idaho, the Pocatello Watercolor Society, and the Portneuf Valley Photographic Society. We are working on identifying new members and appreciate all those past members who have re-joined us. Dues help the Center grow its programs, offer art classes and workshops and connected artist and patrons from many walks of life. Also, current members are encouraged to encourage friends and colleagues to become members. A strong art community is fundamental to our humanity and inspires us all by fostering creativity, goodness, and beauty.
