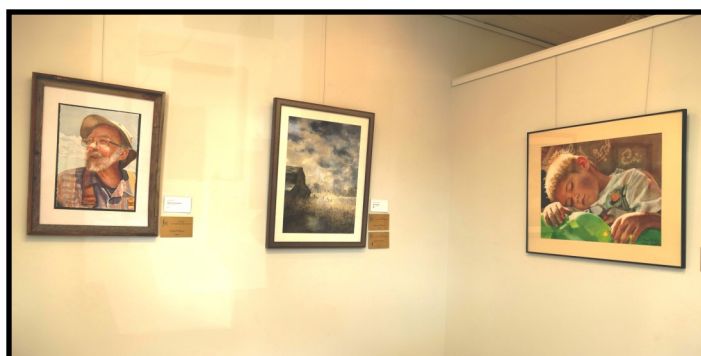
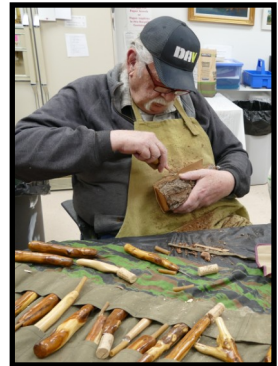

The *Festival of Trees*, sponsored by the Pocatello/Chubbuck School District 25 Education Foundation, will once again be in the Idaho State University Performing Art Center during the month of December. The Pocatello Art Center has been invited to decorate a tree for this signature event. We are asking members to create a small piece of art to hang on our tree. We have small frames available at the Center. The work should be 3 x 3 inches.

We are also planning an “**Art Date**” with members, Wednesday, November 7 from 3 to 8 p.m where we will be making art pieces to hang on the tree. These will include small watercolor paintings, paintings on yupo with alcohol inks, air dry clay ornaments, and acrylic paintings on small wooden disks. We have purchased a supply of white and silver 3x3 frames that will be fitted with hangers and placed on the tree. If you would be willing to paint something that would fit in a small frame suitable for hanging on the Art Center's tree it will be appreciated. SUMMARY OF MINUTES
OCTOBER 4, 2018

*President Carolyn Purnell called the meeting to order at 10:20am.

***Present:** Marilyn Smith, Peggy Bain, Karen Vargason, Bea Cowger, Dorothy Brzek, Peggy Anderson, Daav Corbett, Pat Geiger, Victoria Zalatoris, Roger Boe, Jennifer Fisher, Becky Petersen, Linda Groom

***Excused:** Larry Petersen, Audrey Cole, Joyce Rendace, Marsha Losser

***Computer Discussion:** Due to a suspected power surge or some other major event, the Office computer died. The Point-of-Sale at the Front Desk also crashed. Larry Petersen took the computer to Galaxy Computers where they determined the Mother Board had died. It would cost around \$350 to fix and the computer is 5 years old. The Executive Committee decided it was best to purchase a new computer. Jennifer Fisher wrote a grant for education that included money toward purchasing a laptop computer that could be used in the classroom. Money from that grant will help fund the new laptop computer in the office. The computer can be used in the office with the large monitor and the keyboard and then moved to the classroom when needed.

*Programs need to be installed on the new computer. Office Suite has changed and is now done by a monthly subscription of \$8/month or \$96/year. A discussion was held to determine if PAC should purchase the subscription or buy an old version of Office for about \$300. After the discussion, Linda moved to buy the update to Office Suite to the subscription. Jennifer second. Motion passed

1. Administration/Art Center Building Group: Carolyn Purnell

***Minutes:** Linda moved to hold the Minutes until the next meeting. Roger second. Motion passed.

***Treasurer's Report:** Niccole will give one next month after the new computer is set up and she can access records.

***Correspondence:** Peggy has sent about 16 cards in the last month. She is caught up. The memorial Plaque needs to be updated. The place PAC has used to purchase name plates is no longer available. Paul's Trophy is the only place that does it now. The new plaques will be different than the old ones.

***Desk:** More help is needed. A suggestion was made to write a letter to the membership detailing the advantages of working at the Desk. Committees were formed to solve some temporary problems at the Desk.

***Fundraising/Development:** A report was completed regarding the \$4800 grant the PAC received this year from the Bistline Foundation for our Children's Art Program. This grant has let us expand our offering during the summer and the school year. In addition to our summer classes, we are now offering some Saturday classes and after school classes for elementary and middle school students. We sincerely appreciate being able to buy quality art materials for our classes as we find the connection between quality materials and quality artwork becomes noticeable along the way and emerging artists often desire to have the best materials possible as they create their work. As students become serious about their art, no matter what age, they also get serious about the materials they use.

*Sagebrush expenses will be reviewed the second week of October to determine what type of fund-raising activities will be required to continue the event next year. By November 1, we will also submit a grant to Idaho Community Foundation for continued assistance with our programs.

2. Communities Outreach Reports:

***Sagebrush:** The Committee met to discuss the 2018 event at ISU. A summary was presented to the Board and a discussion followed. The configuration of booths for this year worked well, other than the stage, which could be more centrally located. It was suggested that the venue be changed because of problems with parking, food, and alcohol at the present location. New site recommendations are Caldwell Park and Ross Park. Several vendors suggested the event become a 3-day event: Friday afternoon, Saturday, and a short Sunday. It was recommended to continue using ZAPP.

*There are concerns as well. More volunteers are needed to make Sagebrush be effective. Change the way the Fest has been done in the past. There was a suggestion to meet with the new president of ISU and work more closely with the university. Work to include more entities in the community to form a different group and do Sagebrush in a completely different way. It was strongly suggested to quit Sagebrush or do it differently.

***Publicity:** In September the Publicity Committee continued to advertise and publicize PAC events through print and online platforms. We also began advertising for the upcoming classes starting in October. There are a lot of events going on at PAC and we are working to include them all in the weekly rotation of online and print media publicizing.

*On a personal note, I (Daav Corbet) will need to step down from the PAC Board and my duties as head of the Publicity Committee. My family and I have decided to move to Wisconsin for personal reasons. Our exact move date is not yet set, but will be within a few weeks. I can continue as head of publicity for the time being.

***Legacy:** Roger expressed gratitude for the support for the Bob Rush show in September. It was a beautiful show.

***Newsletter:** Carolyn could not send out the October Newsletter due to the computer being down. It will be sent when the computer is up and running.

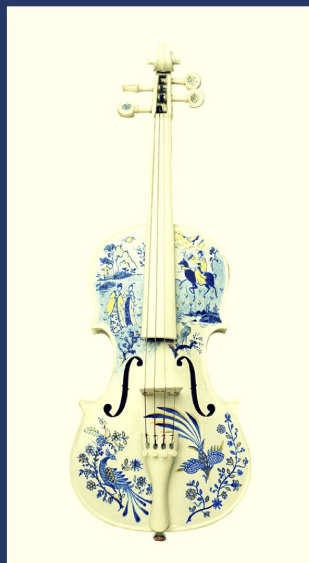
